- We work with local communities to provide life-changing school meals in places where poverty and hunger prevent children from gaining an education.
- Mary's Meals began in 2002 when our founder, Magnus MacFarlane-Barrow, visited Malawi during a famine and met a mother dying from AIDS. When he asked her eldest son, Edward, what his dreams were in life, he replied simply: "To have enough food to eat and to go to school one day."
- Our vision is that every child receives one daily meal in their place of education and that all those who have more than they need, share with those who lack even the most basic things.



- It only costs £13.90 / €15.60 / \$19.50 to feed a child with Mary's Meals for a whole school year!
- We feed 1,504,471 children in 18 countries every school day!
- It's a simple idea that works! Research shows that children who eat Mary's Meals have more energy, feel healthier and happier, find it easier to concentrate and do better in school.
- We are committed to keeping costs low at least 93% of donations are spent on our charitable work.

- Mary's Meals is owned and run by local communities. We provide food, training and equipment so that volunteers can cook and serve school meals for their children.
- We have more than 80,000 volunteers in Malawi alone.

Veronica, who became an orphan aged nine, was one of the first children to receive Mary's Meals at school. She recently graduated from university!


She told us: "Eating Mary's Meals at school helped me concentrate and education gave me the confidence to succeed.

"Thank you for helping Mary's Meals so that other children have the chance of a better life and can fulfil their dreams, like I did."



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

Kaphirikwete Primary School now has 619 pupils enrolled, made up of 305 boys and 314 girls. The children range from Standards 1 to 8.

There are 4 permanent classrooms at the school and the pupils are taught by a total of 8 teachers. The school's water source is a borehole in the school grounds, which is very close to the kitchen, and there are 14 pit latrine toilets on site which are shared equally between the boys and girls.

In addition to a woodlot/maize garden, the school has a football pitch for the children to use.


"Our children come to school hungry, and the porridge is attracting lots of children to attend school, they no longer desert classes."






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
